◆ <u>Budget Development</u> - presentation by Superintendent Fiore & Business Manager Deb Palmer Some hard decisions must be made tonight –the final budget will be presented at the April 17 meeting, with adoption at the April 22 meeting. TRS and ERS (retirement systems) Leveling - Downfall of this option to reduce expenses for 2013-14 is that the District is only pushing off the debt and having to pay later with a locked-in high interest rate. Presentation represented a 7 % increase on the tax levy, which leaves a \$466,047 gap. Board feels that all positions and programs on the cut list are crucial to the education of our students. They requested that a budget be prepared with a 9% increase on the tax levy, not considering the Retirement Leveling option, and use reserves for the balance.
