- As programing develops and new challenges arise, the fine arts booster club wants to step up and help support the fine arts students and the teachers to make sure their experiences in all programs are enhanced, rewarding, and more than just learning how to perform or display their art works.

- To provide a safe and positive environment in an after school or extracurricular activity that encourages and fosters responsibility, discipline, and teamwork; while also providing an environment where our students can be actively involved in a program where their parents can also participate on some levels.

- Fundraising opportunities to help resource and support the fine arts Educational structures/ programming. Any fundraising ideas will be carefully measured against those that already exist- careful consideration will be taken to avoid duplication, or adding an unnecessary financial burden on our community.

- We currently have 8-10 parents wanting to be involved. We have at the moment 4-7 more parents interested and ready to help, and have reached out to the elementary music and art teachers, who are looking forward to having extra helping hands.

We believe arts affects educational value. To further exemplify and validate this point, there was an article on page 7 of the ON BOARD newspaper titled "Arts educational lessons behavior problem, boosts writing skills" This article speaks of a study by researchers at Texas A&M and the University of Missouri with the elementary and middle school students in the Houston Independent School District, among others. In short, "Researchers found positive casual influences on student's behavior, students emotional and academics. Findings show a 3.6 percent point drop in disciplinary measures and improvement in writing and more compassion for people." Also "In addition, participating schools had school leaders who believed in the importance of arts education and supported school-community arts education partnership model." With your approval and support with creating a Fine Arts Booster Club, we believe we can make a difference in the future of our students.
